RE: STIRLING WIND PROJECT UPDATE

Dear Stakeholder:

Stirling Wind Project LP (“SWLP”) is pleased to announce the following update on the Stirling Wind Project (“SWP”).

In December 2018, the Alberta Electric System Operator (“AESO”) announced that the SWP was successful in its Renewable Electricity Program Round 2 (“REP 2”). REP 2 was a competitive procurement process administered by the AESO to procure up to 300 MW of renewable energy and included a minimum 25% Indigenous equity ownership requirement. SWLP and the AESO have signed a 20-year Renewable Electricity Support Agreement for the SWP.

As part of the qualifying criteria for REP 2, SWLP is proud to announce that it entered into a partnership agreement with the Paul First Nation for a minority stake in the project. The Paul First Nation occupies land along Wabamun Lake, Alberta, situated approximately 70 kilometres west of Edmonton, Alberta.

SWLP is continuing to develop the project including advancing the AUC permitting process. Over the next few months, SWLP will provide additional updates on the project and schedule.

SWLP is committed to continuing to share project information and consulting with the public to ensure that we hear and address stakeholder concerns and input.
